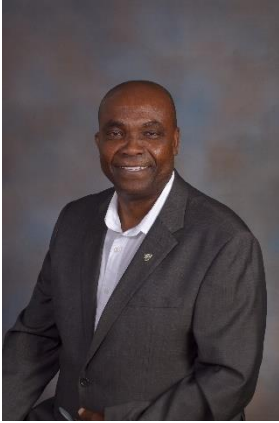




Get to know University Councillor Nosa O. Egiebor, PhD'85:
