I am writing to clarify the Senate Committee on Academic Procedure's (SCAP) responsibilities with respect to Faculty/School grading scales, in response to the April 22, 2010 Senate agenda item VII 2., "Student Evaluation, Progress, and Promotion Policy of the School of Medicine", which was referred to SCAP.

As outlined in SCAP's Terms of Reference, SCAP is responsible for "...examin[ing] and approv[ing] grading systems throughout the University". The changes to the School of Medicine's grading scheme, as described in its Student Evaluation, Progress, and Promotion Policy, were incorporated into the University's new grading scheme and approved by SCAP. No further action is required.

If a Faculty or School wishes to make an amendment to the grade that will be used in the evaluation of its students, the change(s) must align with and meet the University's grading scheme and be forwarded to SCAP for examination and approval.
