Senate Education Equity Committee (SEEC) Annual Report May 15, 2009

INTRODUCTION

The Senate Educational Equity Committee is responsible for academic equity-related policy in all matters pertaining to the academic mission of the University.

The responsibilities of the Committee include:

- reviewing and, where necessary, recommending revision to existing academic policy or the creation of new policy related to educational equity;
- monitoring and reporting to Senate on the effectiveness of the University in the implementation and administration of educational equity-related policy;
- the initiation and execution of research, as required, to inform the development of or the implementation of recommendations regarding educational equity-related policy;
- setting up subcommittees or task forces and inviting such representatives necessary to ensure the participation of equity interest groups at Queen's in the work of the Committee;
- receiving representation from and communicating and sharing equity-related information with the Queen's community;
- coordinating the execution of its responsibilities with other bodies at Queen's
 responsible for equity-related policy and with the officers of the University who have
 responsibility for the implementation of equity-related policy.

ACTIVITIES

The SEEC met seven times during the 2008-2009 academic year. The majority of the Committee's focus was reviewing the Educational Equity Policy statement and accompanying report. The SEEC separated into four (4) sub-committees: Research and Curriculum; Climate and Environment; Access and Retention; and Processes. The sub-committees researched each theme and the new draft policy was presented to the Committee in May 2008.

In addition to the work mentioned above, the SEEC also:

- 1. Continued to monitor, discuss and respond to racial incidents on campus:
 - a. Islamophobic incidents on campus
 - b. Responded and supported the QUMSA report
- 2. Invited guest speakers:
 - a. Magda Lewis, Principal Researcher, "Best Practices"
 - b. Jacob Mantle, ASUS president

- 3. Responded and discussed programs on campus:
 - a. Intergroup Facilitators Program
 - b. Anti-Racism Week
 - c. Queen's D.A.R.E. Panel
 - d. QNS Competitions
- 4. Discussed general developments on equity, diversity and racism:
 - a. The SEEC website
 - b. USAT accessibility issues
 - c. Research proposal on "Best Practices"
 - d. The naming of Robert Sutherland Hall
 - e. The Breslauer Report
 - f. The Henry Report recommendations

NEW MEMBERSHIP

The SEEC was pleased to have four newly elected members join the Committee. They are: Heidi Penning, Ronald Price, Matthew Reesor and Katherine Rudder. Also, the SEEC started off the 2008/09 academic year with a new Chair, Adnan Husain, and a new Secretary to the Committee, Jill Christie.

- Continue to liaise with M. Lewis regarding the "Best Practices" research.
- Involvement with developments on equity, diversity and racism issues on campus.
- Review of the D.A.R.E. report.
- Review of the Human Rights Office and the Equity Office annual report.
- Follow up with SORC in October 2009 regarding the Henry report recommendations.
- Work with the Principal's Office to help in the redesign and reimplementation of the QNS Program.
- Comment on the Breslauer report.
