Annual Committee Report to Senate
October 2008**

Annual Report for SCAP 2007/08

As a matter of routine annual business, SCAP approved:

- Spring and Fall 2008 convocation schedules;
- sessional dates for 08/09;
- Report to Senate on the Number and Type of Academic Dishonesty Cases Reviewed in 2006-07, submitted to Senate for information

In additional business, SCAP:

- approved a change to convocation dates, moving Spring Convocation from the last week of May and first week of June to the first two weeks of June;
- approved amendments to the Policy on Confidential Exams and the Policy on Disrupted Examinations, as recommended by the SCAP Subcommittee on Examinations, and informed Senate of such;
- approved hood designs for the MNSc, MM, BPHE, and BSc(Kin) degrees;
- reviewed the proposed draft Code of Conduct and submitted feedback to the Senate Committee on Non-Academic Discipline;
- reviewed one case of a breach of academic integrity;
- collected information from Faculties and Schools on their academic dishonesty statistics for future analysis and reporting purposes

Regarding continuing matters, SCAP was referred by the Vice-Principal (Academic) and the SCAP Sub-Committee on Academic Integrity:

- a recommendation "...that the Senate Committee on Academic Procedures (SCAP) review existing policies on academic dishonesty, and in particular consider the viability of a single university-wide policy with faculty-specific additions as needed, with the goal of bringing consistency and proportionality to sanctions for academic dishonesty and greater commonality of practice among departments and faculties"

- > In Spring 2008, SCAP delivered a draft policy to Senate with a request for feedback from the University community
- > SCAP intends to consider all feedback received, make any necessary changes to the policy, and present it to Senate for final approval in Fall 2008
