Mark Lawall is a specialist in the study of transport amphoras, ancient ceramic containers for shipping wine, oil, and many other foodstuffs. These artifacts are widely recognized as some of the best archaeological evidence for the study of ancient trade and economies. Lawall has published both methodological papers on the use and abuse of these artifacts as evidence for economic history as well as numerous reports on finds from various sites including the Athenian Agora, Ephesos, Troy, and Gordion. His ongoing research extends to areas of Turkey, Greece, Ukraine, and Cyprus.
