Dineo Skosana is a senior researcher and a leader of the coal mining project that examines South Africa's transition from coal mining and burning to clean energy at Society, Work and Politics Institute (SWOP), Wits University in South Africa. Her focus is on mining-induced dispossession which is central to rationalising, amongst other reasons, why the just transition from coal is necessary.

She holds a PhD in Political Science from the University of the Witwatersrand, and her doctorate research explored the contestations over coal mining and African grave exhumations in the Mpumalanga province (South Africa).
