About the City: Singapore is small, but a thriving modern centre of commerce and industry, as well as a food, shopping, and entertainment. Singapore is an island republic situated between the countries of Malaysia and Indonesia. Singapore has a population of 4.2 million people of various ethnic communities and cultures, mainly Chinese, Malay, Indian and other smaller communities. English is the language of business and administration. It is also the medium of instruction of schools and at the University. Most Singaporeans are bilingual and are able to speak English and at least one other language—usually Mandarin, Malay or Tamil.

About the University: Nanyang Technological University (NTU) is a research intensive university with globally acknowledged strength in science and engineering. It has 12 schools organized under a four college structure and is home to 20,000 undergraduate and 8,700 graduate students. NTU is ranked amongst the top 25 technology universities in the world today. The university's academic and research programs have reaped strong support from major corporations and industry leaders. NTU's international outreach is broad and includes academic and research partnerships with more than 300 institutions in 45 countries.

Travel and Residence Information

Accommodation: International Students are guaranteed on-campus accommodation. You can apply online starting at the beginning of May. The sixteen Halls of Residence are home to some 9200 students. This community forms a massive family unit, actively engaging in social exchange and mutual help. Living in a hall is a unique experience. The halls of residence offer similarly styled accommodation. With the exception of Halls 1 & 2 which offer shared suite-style attached shower and toilets, all halls have gender specific communal showers and toilets.

All halls are co-ed by floor or wing and offer single and double occupancy rooms. Rooms are furnished with a desk, desk chair, shelving, bed and wardrobe per resident. There are phone jacks and Ethernet connections in each room. More information about individual halls can be found here:

Visa: No "visa for entry" into Singapore is required for nationals from countries that have full and open diplomatic links with Singapore (e.g. Australia, Brunei, Canada, Germany,

Permits: All international students are required to hold a valid **Student's Pass** issued by the Immigration and Checkpoint Authority (ICA) for their studies at NTU. You can apply for one on-line on the ICA website http://www.ica.gov.sg/services_centre_overview.aspx?pageid=256&secid=182.

If the exchange period of study at NTU is more than 6 months, exchange students are required to undergo a medical examination before being issued the Student's Pass by the Immigration and Checkpoints Authority (ICA). This includes the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and Tuberculosis (TB) medical tests. The medical examination costs \$36.75 (SGD) and must be done at the Medical Centre in NTU.
