His most recent books are *The Soldier and the Changing State: Building Democratic Armies in Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas* (Princeton, 2012), *Democratic Breakdown and the Decline of the Russian Military* (Princeton, 2007), and, as co-editor, *Is Democracy Exportable?* (Cambridge, 2009). Dr. Barany has held visiting appointments at Stanford, Oxford, Edinburgh, and the East-West Center in Honolulu and is an elected life member of the Council on Foreign Relations (New York).
