**Message from Dr. Patricia Minnes,
Chair of the Clinical Program**



Another year has flown and this will be my last message as Chair of the Clinical Program. Many thanks to everyone for the unexpected send off at the Reception for Clinical Supervisors in April. I feel that I've learned a great deal in the past 11 years and am very pleased with the way that the Clinical Program has evolved. The progress we have made would not have happened without the support and assistance of many people. Many thanks to Kate Harkness, Wendy Craig, Dean Tripp and Marjory Phillips who all have fulfilled the important role of Coordinator of Clinical Practica during my terms as Chair. I am deeply grateful to Jane Leach for all her support over the years. I couldn't have managed without you, Jane! Also, many thanks to Gail MacAllister,

Marg Lawson and Jane Dauncey who also have provided valuable support.

The following pages highlight the events of another busy year in the Clinical Program. Two of the issues addressed this year by the Clinical Committee were related to accreditation and the Clinical Program curriculum. Following an initiative by the Canadian Council of Professional Psychology Programs (CCPPP) and considerable discussion with faculty and students, we voted not to reapply for APA Accreditation next fall when we submit our application to CPA for reaccreditation. APA has decided to no longer provide accreditation to programs outside the United States starting in 2014. In anticipation of this change, Queen's has taken the plunge along with a number of other Canadian Universities. One concern raised prior to this decision was that applications to the Clinical Program would be affected. However, we had over 100 excellent applicants this year. We also completed a review of the Clinical Program curriculum in preparation for our accreditation self-study next year. Given the heavy course load of Clinical students, we managed to reduce the course load by one half course at the MA level and another half course at the PhD level. Courses also have been reorganized to provide more research skills earlier in

the MA program and provide more intensive clinical skills training at the PhD level. These changes will make our program more consistent with other accredited Clinical Programs in Canada.

In March this year, an Open House for potential new graduate students was held. Attendance was excellent and we are looking forward to welcoming 7 new graduate students to the Clinical Program in the fall.

We also were very pleased that the 4 students applying for internships were successfully matched and will be taking up positions in Calgary, Hamilton and Kingston.

The Psychology Clinic has had a very successful year. An Advisory Committee for the Clinic has been established with Wendy Craig, Uzma Rehman, Marjory Phillips and myself as members. Many thanks to Marjory Phillips who continues to do an excellent job as Director of the Clinic and Coordinator of Clinical Practica. Her many contributions to Clinical Training were formally recognized this year at the Reception for Clinical Supervisors where the students presented Marjory with this year's Clinical Supervisor's Award.

Next year will be an eventful year. We are looking forward to hiring a new Clinical faculty member to work in the child clinical area and we will be reapplying for CPA Accreditation. I am very pleased that the Clinical Program is progressing so well and am sure that there will be many new developments under the direction of Wendy Craig.

Best wishes to all and many thanks for your support over the years.

THE PSYCHOLOGY CLINIC AT QUEEN'S

We have completed our first academic year at the Clinic and we are pleased to report that we are meeting our goals for excellence in student training and for clinical service provision to the community.

Phase One of the Clinic officially opened its doors to the public in September 2005, providing psychological assessment and intervention to children and youth aged infancy to the completion of high school. Providing a valued service to the community, the Clinic has received over 175 referrals to date and we have provided service to almost 100 children and youth.

Clinical Training:

Since September 2005, five students in the Clinical Psychology program have completed practicum placements at the Clinic, with an additional eleven students picking up an assessment or treatment case to further their individual clinical training goals.

Over the fall and winter terms, three of the clinical skills courses (interviewing, child assessment, child group) supplemented didactic instruction with observations of clients from the Clinic. We look forward to further developing the link between clinical teaching and practical skills acquisition in the future.

Community Partnerships:

Internship Consortium: The Psychology Clinic has joined the internship consortium in partnership with the Regional Assessment Resource Centre (RARC), Health, Counselling & Disability Services (HCSD), and the Regional Treatment Centre (RTC). We are planning for our first intern for September 2006 and have initiated discussions about applying for accreditation with CPA.

Queen's Paediatric Rehabilitation Team: The Psychology Clinic has partnered with occupational therapy and physiotherapy staff at the Queen's Physiotherapy Clinic to offer a multi-disciplinary approach to assessment. We are at the initial phase of developing this relationship but hope that the venture will provide inter-professional training opportunities for our students.

Pathways for Children and Youth: Since January 2006, the Psychology Clinic has established a contractual relationship with this children's mental health agency to provide complex diagnostic assessments, working in partnership with the mental health providers and families.

Child Development Centre, Hotel Dieu Hospital: Since February 2006, the Psychology Clinic has established a

contractual relationship with this children's rehabilitation facility to provide preschool developmental assessments.

Research Partnerships: The Psychology Clinic has entered into partnerships to provide psychological assessments for two researchers studying infants and preschoolers, respectively. The venture provides an opportunity to integrate clinical work with research and gives our students unique opportunities for work with very young children.

Future Directions:

Over the winter term, we formed a Clinic Advisory Committee to provide the Clinic Director with additional supports to brainstorm solutions to problems and to ensure that the Clinic develops in a manner that is consistent with the vision for the Clinical Programme.

At present, plans for further expansion of the Psychology Clinic are put on hold pending the availability of additional space. Currently, our two clinical rooms are in constant use and the lack of additional office space limits the inclusion of an additional on-site supervisor or staff member. However, we are initiating planning for Phase Two of the Clinic and we welcome input.
