## Teaching Portfolio

### Teaching Philosophy – Dean A. Tripp, PhD

Early in my independent teaching career as a graduate student (1991-1992), when I was teaching a full-year Introduction to Psychology class to 350 students, my vision of teaching was a transmission model where I would provide students with the information or content through didactic lectures. My own University experiences in the classroom shaped this initial delivery style. However, I felt comfortable in this style, and my willingness to listen and respond to students' questions during large lectures and their desire to engage me led to second thoughts. After attending a teaching roundtable at the center for learning at Saint Mary's University that year, I was resolute in making a concerted effort to bring the large lecture hall to "life" for students. I remembered hearing of the British Nuffield approach, which focused on a "process" approach emphasizing the student as an active participant in the classroom or lab. I started by providing the class with a question and discussion period where they would be asked to discuss a topic or issue in mental health with a group of students surrounding them and then asked for the group feedback. It was noisy but exciting, and the student response was tremendously upbeat! From that year on, my teaching large and small classes found a new direction and purpose. I was convinced then and still today that good education has to involve students acting actively in their learning.

Throughout my University teaching career, I have sought out and used different teaching methods. For example, I have used clickers and in-class surveys, group activities in large and small classes, and multiple points during the course where I stopped the lecture and asked for student volunteers to help me explain a subject. I have had students present posters in an in-class conference on particular topics to each other. I have also used Twitter and other forms of social media to communicate with students, including skype. I bring "real" people to class to discuss mental health issues from patients' perspectives. I require students to write reflection papers on the meaning of their educational experiences in their broader life. I provide colourful case examples in all my classes and teach life lessons within the chaos of the terrible experiences people face and conquer or succumb to. This level of communication is deep and emotional for many of my students. I am always willing to learn from my students what excites them or scares them. Without a doubt, a teacher also needs to know. I have taken graduate supervision courses, attended many meetings concerning teaching methods and applications, and sought advice from education experts within my university and elsewhere. I have committed many hours to committees where educational transformation is of keen interest in and outside the University (e.g., Psychology 100 redesign committee, Educational Sig of Canadian Pain Society).

In recent years, my teaching philosophy has focused on interactive learning, using new tools, and manipulating learning situations (e.g., small-group education and discussion). I also have focused on the characteristics of excellent teachers for inspiration. Perhaps most importantly, I believe in communicating and practicing a fair and respectful attitude with my students in and out of the classroom. Students have always supported my firm belief in respecting learners' opinions and positions. I always try to encourage critical thinking and independence of ideas based on empirical findings... a scientist-practitioner model. I add to this by honestly communicating the limit of my knowledge while stressing the necessary tactics for amassing balanced and thoughtful perspectives (i.e., critical thinking). I carry this interactional respect further and spend considerable time considering learner assessment. As such, I have employed many types of assessment, including group projects, independent writing, intrapersonal reflection papers, in-class presentations, student workshops where they teach the class a

topic, peer evaluation, etc. I also provide individualized, detailed feedback when conducting seminar and graduate classes, especially in the Clinical Psychology Therapy classes I teach (N = approx 5-7).

As suggested above, I have actively used technology in teaching when I have viewed it as appropriate. I have been recently intrigued by new approaches (blended teaching models) and have successfully implemented parallels between my previous teaching style and new technologies. I have used computer-administered testing, developed computer-assisted learning units (e.g., Psychology 100), and used electronic bulletin boards at the university. In my consulting teaching outside the University, I have conducted web-based series for working professionals, I have filmed an educational film series for Health Psychology called the Chapter Insider (McGraw-Hill), conducted numerous small interactive workshops, and I have been highly active in Interprofessional Education (please see CV for details). In nearly all of these experiences, I have found that learners greatly benefit from using technology.

I have also become very aware of “learning styles.” My group has presented at a National Meeting (Canadian Pain Society Meeting) outlining physician learning styles. It is critical to acknowledge that students learn in different ways, which may act as a disconnect to the instructional kind of the Professor. Thus, flexibility and variety of teaching are not just essential but mandatory. In my classes, I have tried to find a middle ground by using figures, diagrams, animated graphics, and in-class demonstrations for visual learners, all in addition to oral and written explanations in classes.

These experiences have left me in the position to “see” and implement many beneficial advances in the science and practice of teaching. My teaching goals continue to evolve. But the themes that shall remain consistent in my teaching include the communication of my infectious passion for learning, the exhibition of critical thinking processes, respect for other’s opinions, and debate.

### **Teaching: Innovative Course Designs.**

2020-2021

Online - Health Psychology 332. This senior undergraduate course was redesigned to be delivered online. In addition, the learning labs were reformatted to online group labs, where students formed groups to discuss and prepare position papers on health psychology subjects (e.g., cancer, aboriginal health disparity, etc.). These sessions are offset with a weekly asynchronous lecture.

2017-2018

Health Psychology 332. This senior undergraduate course was redesigned with 8 learning labs, where students formed groups to discuss and prepare position papers on health psychology subjects (e.g., cancer, aboriginal health disparity, etc.). These sessions are offset with a weekly lecture.

2010-2013

Senior Undergraduate course on Positive Psychology, which is the scientific study of optimal human function. Lectures critically review the history and current empirical support in the field, such as pleasure and positive experience, happiness, interpersonal relationships, and applying positive thinking. Assignments will enhance student learning by utilizing generative exercises and intra or inter-personal lab assignments.

2002-2014

“Graduate Psychotherapy – Interpersonal Psychotherapy (IPT) Intervention”

This course can be broken down into three related skill development components within the scientist-practitioner model. In the first section of the course, students are provided with a workshop exposure and a general overview of IPT. During the second part of the course, students are required to practice and demonstrate, by videotape, several manualized components of the IPT approach for treating depression (treatment protocols, such as the first session, making joint therapy decisions). In the final part of the course, students are paired with actors playing depressed patients seeking assistance. All sessions are to be videotaped and reviewed by the professor and peer group for content and execution of skills. Particular emphasis will be placed on technical difficulties within the context of the therapy matched to the student's level of psychotherapy experience.

2000-2001

"Advanced Psychological Intervention."

I was responsible for establishing a collaborative link between the Acadia University Counseling Center and the Department of Psychology. The link is a referral network wherein depressed university students from the center are offered psychotherapy through the advanced psychological intervention course. The course is a Cognitive Behavioral Therapy training opportunity that uses a structured/manualized treatment framework. Graduate students deliver treatment. Graduate students are supervised in an individual and a group supervision format. All sessions are videotaped for supervision.
