# Enrolment Report 2018-2019

As of November 1, 2018

This annual report provides details about Queen's enrolment as of November 1, 2018.

The report includes information about total applications and enrolment for the incoming first-year undergraduate class, incoming graduate students, and second degree programs. The report also includes enrolment information for international, self-identified Indigenous and first-generation students.

There are now Indigenous self-identification mechanisms in the common Ontario University Application system (OUAC), Queen's graduate and second degree applications, and on SOLUS. There is a first-generation self-identification mechanism in OUAC, and gender self-identification mechanisms in OUAC and Queen's graduate and second degree applications.

Additional enrolment-based diversity data is currently consolidated from several sources by Institutional Research and Planning and is provided to Senate (most recently at the April 2018 meeting) through the Office of the Deputy Provost (Academic Operations and Inclusion). A working group has been established to determine how best to collect and report on this data going forward.

The enrolment report also includes retention rates, and graduation and completion rates. Most content is reflected in the Student Fall Headcount and Intake chart on p.13 and the Enrolment Summary chart on p.14 prepared by the Office of Planning and Budgeting. Additional data sources are noted.

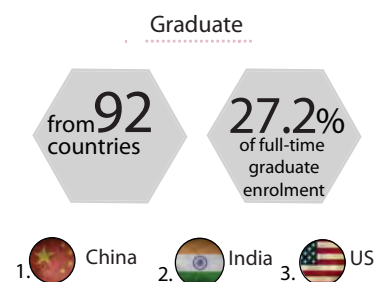
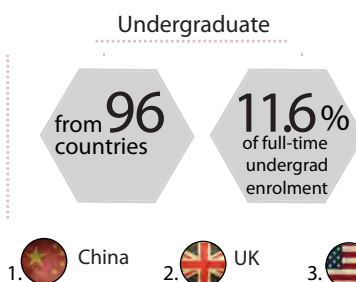


## Total International Students

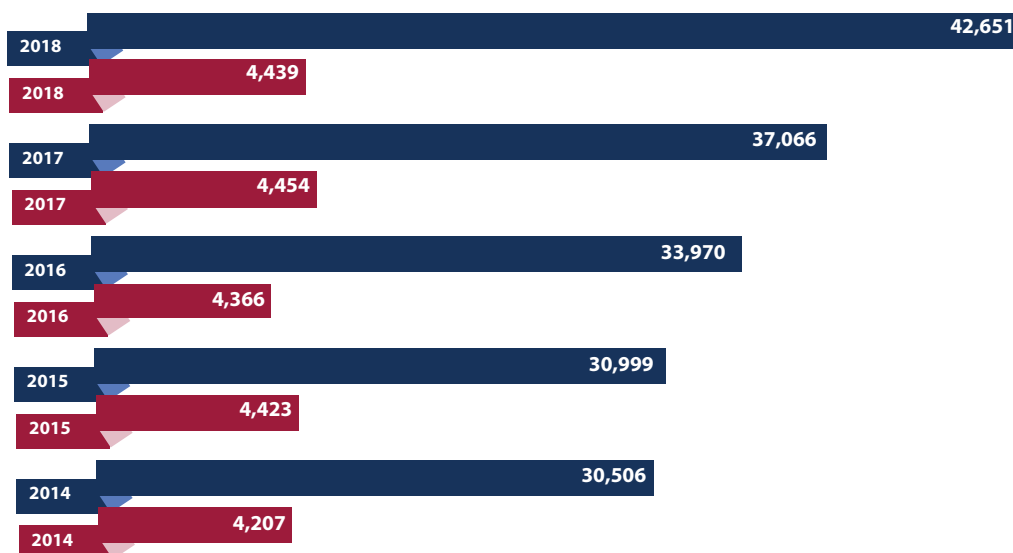

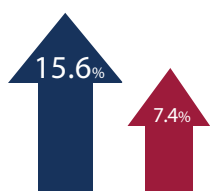

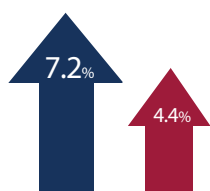

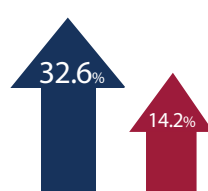
### Year-Over-Year Applications Increases

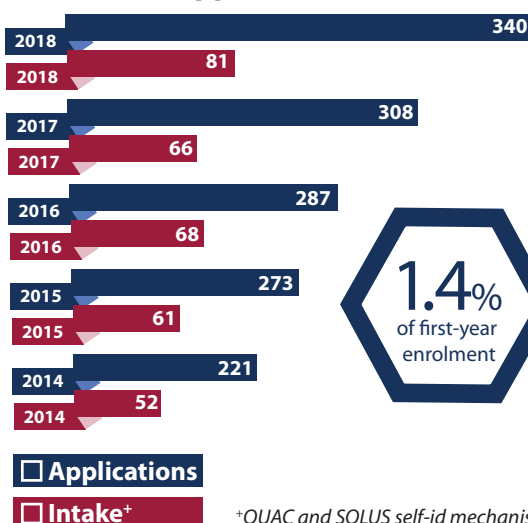
Queen's approved a First-Generation Admission Policy for the 2018-19 year. It provides an additional and alternative pathway for those who are participating in identified community-based programs that help youth in low-income communities complete secondary school, and prepare for a successful transition to post-secondary study. The policy is modelled on the university's long-standing Indigenous Admission Policy.



## Indigenous Students

Queen's continues to build on longstanding outreach and recruitment activities to increase Indigenous enrolment with dedicated staff in Undergraduate Admission and the Four Directions Indigenous Student Centre who provide support throughout the admissions process.

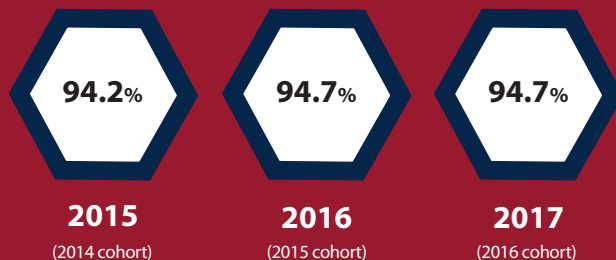
# Undergraduate Retention and Graduation Rates



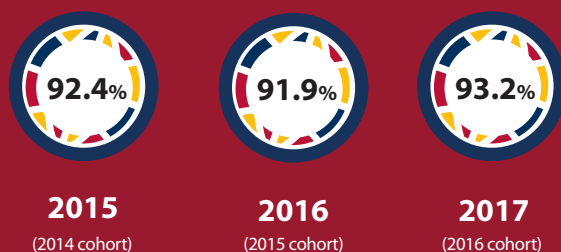
Queen's year 1-2 undergraduate retention, and 7-year graduation rates are among the highest in the country.

## Year 1-2 Retention Rate\*

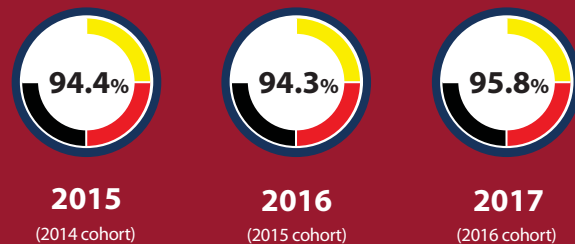

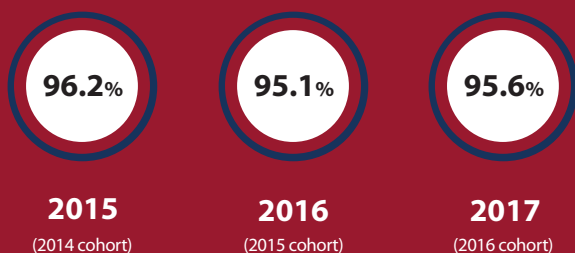

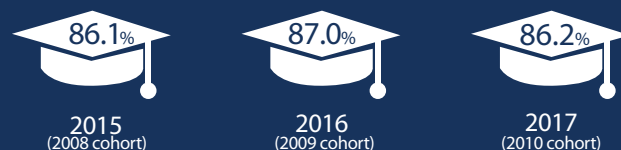

## 7-Year Graduation Rate\*

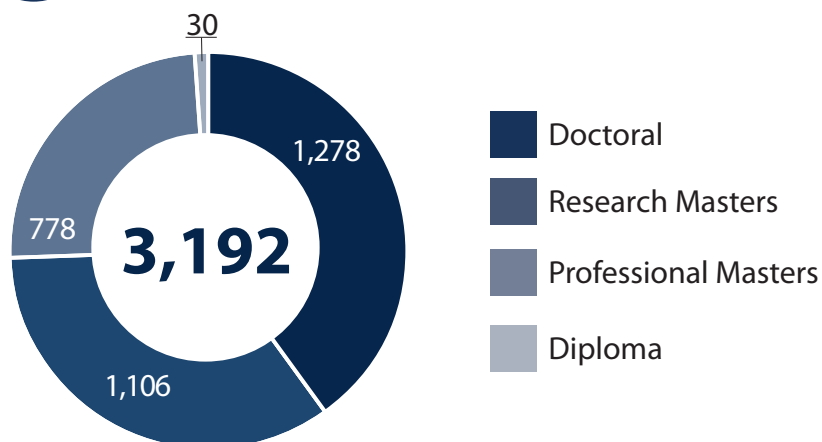

## Total Enrolment 2018-19

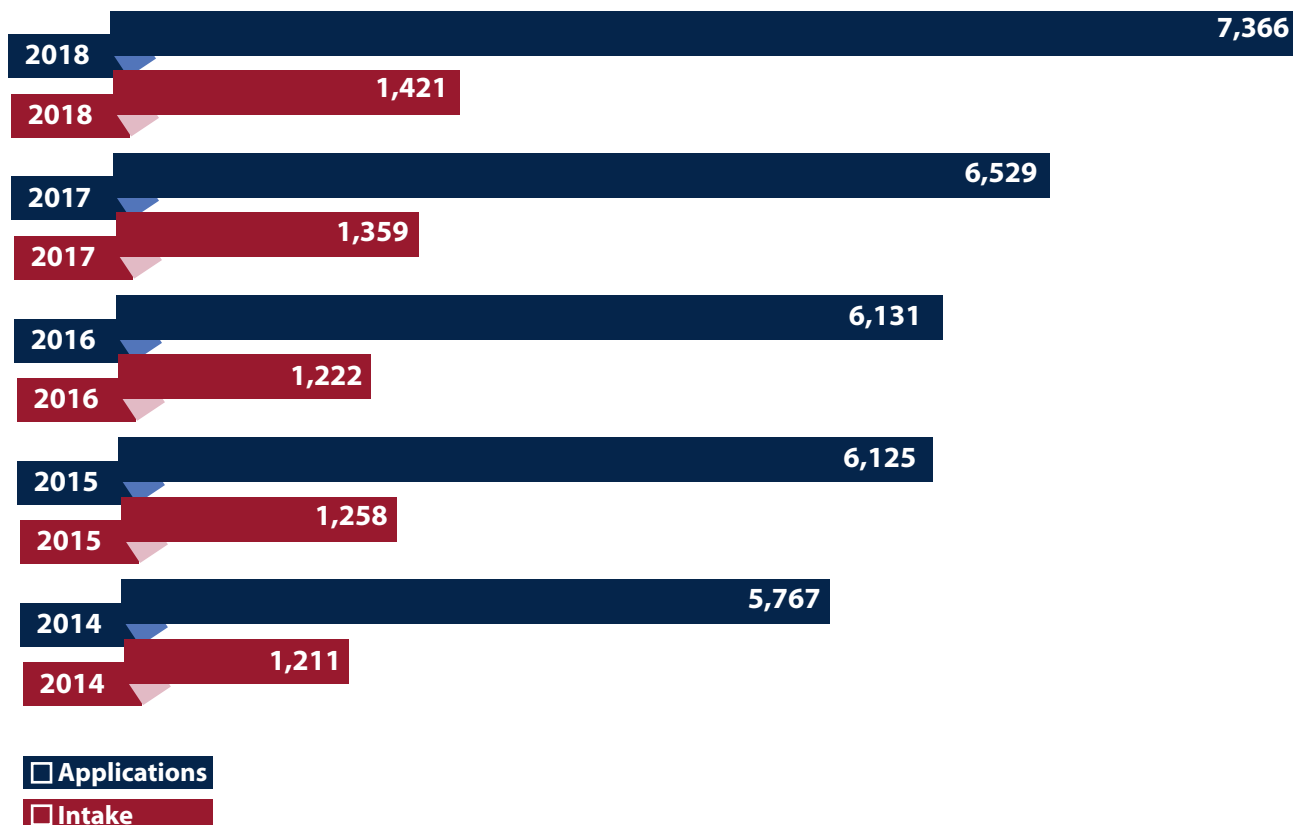

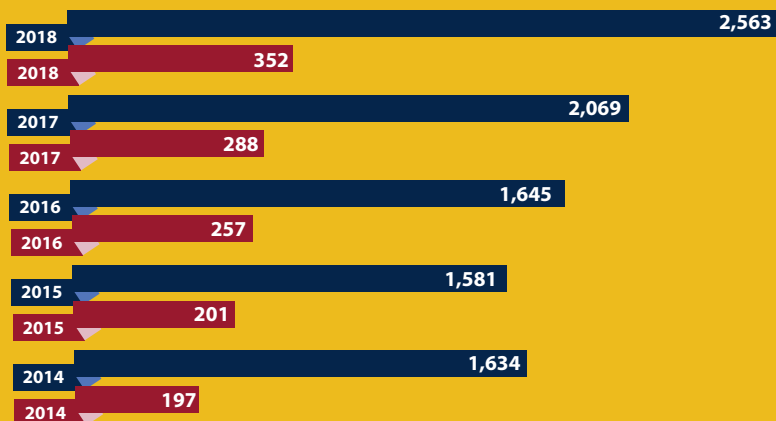

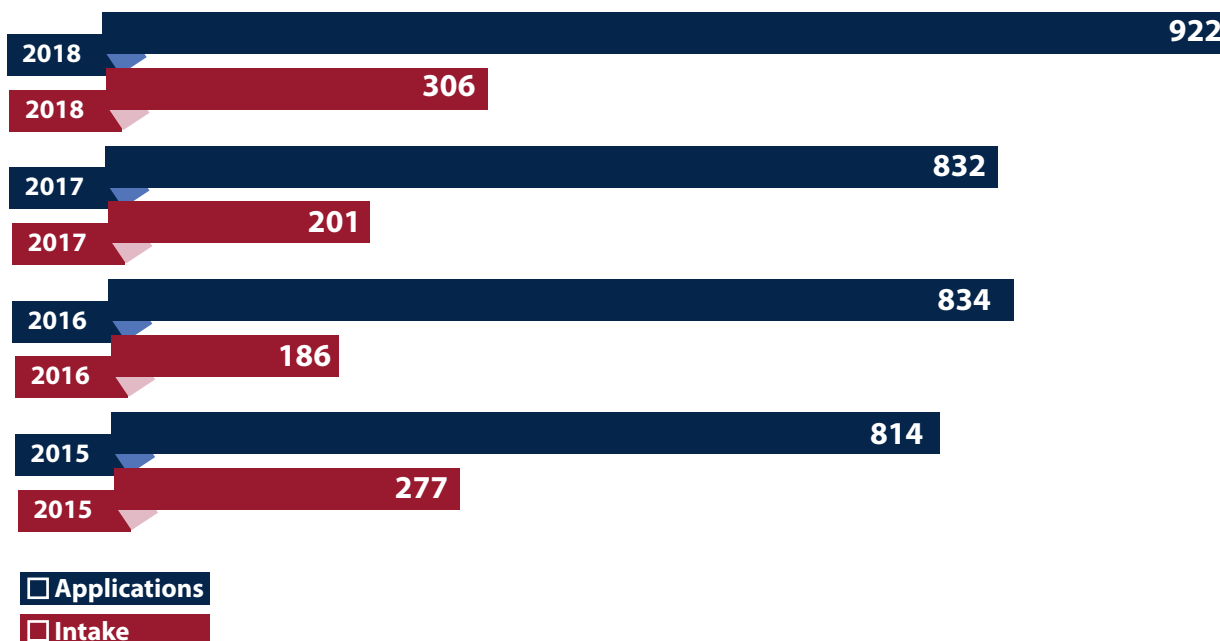




# Consecutive Education
