

### About this Report

This report provides details about Queen's enrolment as of November 1, 2020.

The onset of the global COVID-19 pandemic in winter–spring 2020 led to the transformation of undergraduate recruitment and admission activities. For more information, please see the <u>Student Affairs 2019-20 Annual Report</u>, p. 6.

This enrolment report includes information about total enrolments, details on the incoming first-year undergraduate class and incoming graduate students, and information related to international, self-identified Indigenous, and self-identified first-generation students. For 2020–21, students were able to self-identify through the Ontario University Application system (OUAC), Queen's graduate and second degree applications, and through SOLUS. The university is implementing additional strategies for the 2021-22 cycle to continue to enhance access, and advance equity and diversity in recruitment and admission. 

The School of Graduate Studies offers four masters and PhD programs in a blended format of online and in-person learning. Students enrolled in these programs are counted in the total SGS enrolment.








#### International Students

#### First-Generation Students


The university is enhancing efforts to promote access among under-represented populations, including those who are first-in-their-family to attend a post-secondary institution. In fall 2020, Queen's welcomed the first cohort of five Promise Scholars. This comprehensive program provides dedicated financial, academic and career support to reduce financial barriers and increase access to Queen's among local first-generation students.



Queen's First-Generation Admission Policy provides an additional and alternative pathway for those who are participating in identified community-based programs that help youth in low-income communities complete secondary school, and prepare for a successful transition to post-secondary study. The policy is modelled on the university's long-standing Indigenous Admission Policy.

#### **Indigenous Students**

Queen's continues to build on longstanding outreach and recruitment activities to increase Indigenous student enrolment with dedicated staff in Undergraduate Admission and the Four Directions Indigenous Student Centre who provide support throughout the admissions process.




### Undergraduate Retention and Graduation Rates

Queen's year 1-2 undergraduate retention and 7-year graduation rates are among the highest in the country.


#### Year 1-2 Retention Rate\*



The AVERAGE among the U15 group of Canadian Universities is 90.1%




#### 7-Year Graduation Rate\*












#### Total Enrolment 2020-21










