QUEEN'S UNDERGRADUATE EXIT POLL – EXECUTIVE SUMMARY 2002

Introduction

The University conducted its ninth Exit Poll in 2002. The first poll was undertaken in 1994 and each year has solicited opinions from graduating students in undergraduate programs (both directentry and second-entry professional) about their entire learning experience at Queen's University.

The Exit Poll is designed to present annual insights into the University's overall performance at the undergraduate level, and into each Faculty and School based on students' perceptions of their education as they graduate. The information is valuable for understanding the University's strengths and for identifying areas for improvement. Significant variations in ratings are not expected from one year to the next because students are evaluating their entire University experience. Over time, however, the accumulated data allows a systematic measure of performance as perceived by graduates. Faculties and Schools have access to the data to monitor departmental efforts and the impact of program changes.

The Exit Poll is distributed to all graduating undergraduate students enrolled in programs. While many questions are more directly relevant to direct-entry programs, insights into students' perceptions in second-entry professional programs (Law, Medicine, Education and Rehabilitation Therapy) also provide important information about student learning and development.

In 2003, graduating students from the School of Medicine will be participating for the first time in the Graduation Questionnaire (GQ) administered by the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC). The School of Medicine will also continue to participate in Queen's Exit Poll 2003.

This year saw the first launch of the Exit Poll questionnaire via the web. Students were informed of the process through email and completed their surveys online. All data fed straight into databases for a more effective and efficient analysis process. While an improved response rate was anticipated with the move to an electronic survey, the response rate only increased slightly by 2%. A review of the survey administration and timing is currently underway with the goal of improving response rates in future years.

A copy of the 2002 questionnaire is attached as Appendix 1. The questionnaire focuses on three main areas:

- ◆ The quality of the learning environment (Questions 1a and 1b)
- ◆ The contribution of Queen's education to learning and development in certain areas (Questions 2a and 2b)

• Student satisfaction with services and facilities (Question 3)

Students are also asked to provide additional comments regarding their undergraduate experiences at Queen's (Question 11) and these comments are available to Faculties and Schools.

There were no changes to the questionnaire in 2002. In 2001 one additional question was included that did not appear on previous Exit Polls: *Please indicate the degree to which Queen's contributed to your learning and development in Research Skills* (Question 2V).

As noted, the Exit Poll was developed to measure overall impressions of the University and the results are presented at the Faculty/Schools and institutional levels. The source data is made available to departments and Faculties to provide useful information over time. This report provides only a cursory view of the available information. Further analysis, such as cross-tabulating demographic information by department or concentration and/or by study status can be made available at the Faculty level to provide important information about student opinions. The information should be used to evaluate progress toward stated goals and objectives and may be useful in guiding or informing strategic decisions in the future.

This report highlights specific trends and response variations over the past five Exit Polls (1998 through 2002).

QUESTION 1 - The Quality of the Learning Experience

Students were asked to reflect on their entire experience as a student at Queen's and to indicate how much they agreed or strongly agreed with statements about their learning experience. A scale of 1 (strongly disagree) to 5 (strongly agree) was employed.

Each of the graphs (1a - 1n) shows the percentage of students who agreed or strongly agreed with each statement from 1998 through to 2002. For each unit, an average is calculated across all years, in addition to a trend (assumes linear trend along a straight line), and the delta representing the difference between the trend and the average to provide a general indication of direction.

Highlights:

- ♦ Intellectual stimulation, instructors took an active interest in my learning, and balance between theory and practice (respectively) are the three most important characteristics of Queen's students' learning experiences again in 2002. This is the first time since 1994 that instructors took an active interest in my learning has appeared in the top three spot edging out my learning experience has been enjoyable.
 - Arts & Science, Concurrent Education, Business and Nursing indicated that intellectual stimulation was the most important characteristic.
 - ♦ Applied Science, Education, Medicine, and Rehabilitation Therapy, and Nursing indicated that a good balance between theory and practice was the most important to them.
 - ♦ Law considered instructors who took an active interest in their learning as most important.

- Students gave the highest response rate to my learning experience was intellectually stimulating, up to 84% from 73% last year. Eighty-three percent (83%) of graduates indicated that instructors were readily available outside of class, up from 69% last year. This increase was evidenced across all Faculties with the exception of the School of Medicine, which has been consistent at 59% since 2000 and the School of Nursing which witnessed the 4th consecutive decline.
- ♦ The majority of students (74%) continue to indicate that they have no difficulties enrolling in the courses that they wanted, however Medicine saw a decrease in this measure of satisfaction (down to 60% from 86% last year). Law students registered the highest satisfaction level in 5 years, showing positive progression over the last 3 years.
- ♦ The appropriate use of teaching assistants again received the lowest response rate with 36% of students who agreed or strongly agreed. Exit Poll results contributed to raising the profile of teaching assistant (TA) training, leading to the formation of a Senate Committee on Academic Development (SCAD) sub-committee to review related issues. QUESTION 2 – The Contribution of Student Experiences to Individual Learning and Development

Students were asked to indicate the degree to which their education (both inside and outside the classroom) at Queen's contributed to their learning and development in specific areas. A scale of 1 (very little) to 5 (a great deal) was provided.

Each of the graphs (2a - 2v) shows the percentage of those students responding who circled 4 or 5 (a great deal) in each of the specified areas. For each unit, an average is calculated across all years, in addition to a trend (assumes linear trend along a straight line), and the delta representing the difference between the trend and the average to provide a general indication of direction. Results are shown for all respondents and for each Faculty or School.

Highlights:

Students identified critical judgement, problem-solving skills, and leadership skills (respectively) as the three most important characteristics of their learning experience. Leadership skills nudges out self-confidence for the first time since 1994 to make its first appearance in the top three.

- In 2002, all units except Applied Science, Rehabilitation Therapy, Business and Education identified *critical judgement* as their most important characteristic.
 - Applied Science, Rehabilitation Therapy and Business identified problem solving as most important
 - Students in the Consecutive Education program indicated that leadership skills were the most important, while Concurrent Education students rated critical judgement as most important

- Students registered the highest level of agreement that their Queen's experience contributed to critical judgement (79%), with 73% agreeing that their experience had contributed to problem-solving skills and only 56% responded positively that Queen's contributed to their leadership skills.
- ♦ 80% of all students agreed that the Queen's experience had contributed to their ability to work independently, the strongest level of agreement for all queries in Question 2.
- Business students show significant progress in their computing skills, with 79% agreement up from 51% in 2001. Speaking, problem solving, and sensitivity to ethical issues also increased with at least a 14% gain in each for 2002.
- The Law students who responded feel that their writing and problem solving skills and sensitivity to ethical issues are improving, with an increase of at least 18% in each area over last year.
- ♦ The only question where respondents in every Faculty and School showed an increase in level of agreement over 2001 was *Queen's contributed to sensitivity to ethical issues*.
- ♦ 72% of all students in 2002 indicated that Queen's contributed to the development of research skills, up from 66% in 2001. The range of agreement varies greatly between Faculties and Schools, with a low of 45% in Education and a high of 88% in Law.

QUESTION 3 - Student Satisfaction with Facilities and Services

Students were asked to rate their satisfaction with facilities and services on a scale of 1 (very dissatisfied) to 5 (very satisfied). Students were also given the option to indicate that they were unable to evaluate the facility or service, presumably because they were not familiar with it.

Many of the services listed are provided by more than one office and results must be interpreted in that context. For example, career services, academic counseling, registration services, and computing services are provided by a variety of offices and departments on campus.

Each of the graphs (3a - 3q) show the percentage of those students responding who indicated they were either satisfied (4) or very satisfied (5) with each of the specified services and facilities. The percentages included represent only those students who were able to rate the service or facility and not those students who responded that they were unable to rate the service or facility. The percentage of students who felt they were unable to rate the service is also shown.

Highlights:

◆ The three services in 2002 that students indicated the highest degree of satisfaction with were Library Facilities and Hours, Library Services and Health Services. This has remained consistent since 1996.

- ♦ Those satisfied or very satisfied with Classroom Facilities increased significantly in 2002 to 59% up from 42% the previous year. Law (31%) and Rehabilitation Therapy (48%) students indicated a significant increase in satisfaction level, up 17 % and 27% respectively from 2001.
- Satisfaction with Registration services continues to increase to a high again this year of 65% up from 51% in 2001. Satisfaction with Student Award services decreased again to 54% from 59%. Students in Law and Medicine have registered greater satisfaction in the past two years whereas Arts and Science students' satisfaction rating has consistently declined.
- ♦ Satisfaction with Laboratory Facilities increased to 48% from 37% last year, this is the first increase since 1997.
- ♦ All Faculties and Schools expressed an increased satisfaction with *Computing Facilities* up 11% in 2002 to 68%
- ♦ Satisfaction with Athletic facilities continued to decline in 2002, as has been the case since 1999 and satisfaction with services for international students dipped below the 50% mark to 39% for the first time since 1994.
- ♦ Those satisfied or very satisfied with Career Counseling Services increased in 2001 to 60%, up from 55% the previous year.
- Satisfaction with Residences increased in 2002 to 64% up from 51% in 2001.

Distribution of the Questionnaire

On April 1st 2002, 3,537 emails were sent out to the graduating students' email address on record, directing them to complete the Exit Poll questionnaire on the web using a unique ID. Email reminders were sent in May to non-respondents. A total of 1516 questionnaires were returned.

QUESTIONS 4 to 10 - Demographic Information

Students were asked to provide demographic information about themselves as part of the survey.

The following are the highlights of the demographic profiles, with complete data presented at the end of this report.

- ♦ Of the overall group responding, 62% were women, which has remained relatively unchanged since 1994 (Question #4).
- ♦ 85% of the students responding were 20-24 years of age (Question #5). As would be expected, second-entry professional programs had a higher percentage of respondents in the 25-29

- category: Education (31% 25-29), Law (65% 25-29), Medicine (81% 25-29), and Rehabilitation Therapy (62% 25-29).
- ◆ Arts and Science continues to dominate the overall results with 53% of all surveys returned coming from that Faculty (Question #6).
- ♦ Ninety-eight percent of students were admitted to Queen's with Full -Time status (Question #8); while only 2% of students were admitted to Queen's through mature student regulations (Question #9).
- ♦ Thirty-nine percent of students expected to graduate with a 75-79% grade level. This is followed closely by 33% expecting over 80% (Question #10).


