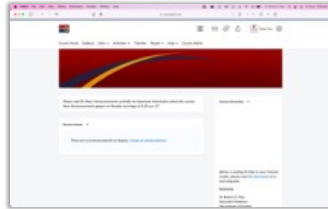

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Multiple-Choice Questions

Each multiple-choice question includes 4 choices of response. Dr May will draw multiple-choice questions directly from course lectures and readings (including Course Notes and PowerPoint slides, if provided). Questions will test students' knowledge of the following categories:

- definitions of literary terms and concepts
- identification of authors and titles from short passages
- examples of literary terms and concepts from short passages
- information about key historical events and contexts

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General Tips

- Exam questions are drawn mainly from the Course Notes. *Focus your study on reviewing and understanding the Course Notes.*
- You are not expected to know biographical information. *Information in the biographical notes will not appear on the Exam.*
- You are expected to know literary terms and concepts. *Make careful note of concepts from the Cuddon Dictionary.*
- You may be asked to identify passages by title or author. *Identification passages will be significant and not obscure.*
- Budget your time wisely and carefully. *You are being asked to answer 100 questions in 120 minutes.*
