Essay Tips

- Brainstorm a strong thesis for the introductory paragraph.
- Maintain a clear and coherent organizational principle.
- Aim to strike a balance between depth and breadth of analysis.
- Contextualize your ideas with quotations (direct, if possible).
- Respond to 1 Examination question only.

Reduce the broad topic to a narrowly focused thesis statement.

Include introductory, concluding, and analytical paragraphs.

Include analytical paragraphs that deal with distinct issues.

Correct MLA Style (in-text citations, Works Cited) is not required.

You will not receive credit for responding to more than 1 prompt.
