Admission Requirements

Selection of teacher candidates is based on the application requirements in TEAS Requirements for Queen's (<https://www.ouac.on.ca/guide/teas-queens/>) as well as the supplemental documents submitted to Education Student Services.

Please note: this form can only be completed once, so please ensure all your documents are finalized and ready for submission.

Candidates must meet at least one of the following requirements:

- 5.0 full-year undergraduate courses in French or the completion of a degree in the French language*, OR
- A French Bilingual/Immersion/Extended Certificate and original transcript from an anglophone secondary school or an original transcript if you have graduated from a francophone secondary school, OR
- Diplôme approfondi de langue française (DALF) (<https://www.delf-dalf.ambafrance-ca.org/>) You will need to achieve an overall classification of C1 (Advanced 1). Test results are valid for life, OR
- Diplôme d'études en langue française (DELF) (<https://www.france-education-international.fr/delf-dalf/>) You will need to achieve an overall classification of B1 (Intermediate 1). Test results are valid for life, OR
- Test de connaissance du français (<https://www.french-exam.com/tcf-exam/>) (TCF) You will need to obtain a score of C1 (Advanced 1 in all four modalities: reading, listening, writing and speaking). Test results are valid for two years, OR

- Test d'évaluation de français (TEF) (<https://www.alliance-francaise.ca/en/exams/tests/tef-canada/>) You will need to obtain a score of C1 (Advanced 1 in all four modalities: reading, listening, writing and speaking). Test results are valid for two years, OR
- An equivalent language proficiency test as determined by Student Services Office (<https://educ.queensu.ca/taxonomy/term/35/>).
