Job title	Part-Time Lecturer (with a sessional workload)

Job purpose	Sessional Lecturers are employed to design and deliver up to a maximum of three courses per academic year. They are integral to the delivery of Bader College's core academic programs, bringing specialised knowledge, real-world expertise, and diversity into the classrooms and thereby enriching the learning experience for students.	
Estimated workload distribution (there is likely to be some annual variation in the required duties)	Sessional Lecturers are employed on a "per course" contract and have no additional duties. A workload plan will be developed for each contract.	

#### Key duties and responsibilities

### Teaching and Learning

- 1. Design a syllabus and deliver a course in line with any requirements outlined by an academic manager.
- 2. Ensure the teaching content, methods of delivery and learning materials meet the defined Learning Outcomes and that students are provided with a high-quality teaching and learning experience.
- 3. Liaise with the Academic Administrator for timetabling.
- 4. Collaborate with the Principal Lecturer of the program to design experiential learning activities for students; take responsibility for the practical components of organising and delivering experiential learning activities, including educational framing and student wellbeing while on off-site academic travel.
- 5. Deliver all course components using appropriate student-centric teaching methods.
- 6. Undertake and complete the administrative work connected with the professional delivery of teaching, including but not limited to promptly responding to communications from academic managers and administrators, setting and evaluating coursework, providing constructive and comprehensive feedback to students in a timely manner (within 14 days), maintaining an up-to-date virtual learning platform, maintaining an accurate record of student attendance, invigilating exams, marking, and submitting results for exams and other evaluations in accordance with Queen's University academic regulations.
- 7. Motivate and support students by being accessible, approachable, and responsive to their communications, providing first-line support for sensitive or confidential issues, and referring students to appropriate support services as needed.
- 8. Ensure equal opportunities for all students, including offering additional support and resources to disadvantaged students, and proactively fostering an inclusive learning environment.

## **Professional and Community Duties**

- 9. Sessional Lecturers are encouraged but not required to:
  - attend and contribute to regular faculty meetings,
  - join in faculty social events,
  - make use of professional development opportunities,
  - support students by attending opening and closing ceremonies and other student events.

Job descriptions are not exhaustive, and employees may be asked with reasonable notice and support to undertake other reasonable duties commensurate with the level of the post as directed by their line manager and the Senior Management Team. Given the nature of this position, some weekend work and international travel might be required subject to the needs of the business.
