## ARTF 125 - Introduction to Studio Art in Printmaking Fine Art (Visual Art) Program

The Fine Art (Visual Art) Program at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching an undergraduate course of *Introduction to Studio Art in Printmaking (ARTF 125, 3 units)*. This is an on-campus studio course with an expected enrolment of about 20 students. Teaching Fellow applicants should be enrolled as a Ph.D. student in a program at Queen's University. Teaching Fellow and Term Adjunct applicants should have an M.F.A. in Visual Art; candidates with teaching experience at the university level in printmaking are preferred. In addition to the above requirements, candidates should be practicing artists with an active exhibition record. This appointment is for the Fall 2023 term, September 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023, with classes in session from September 5, 2023 to December 8, 2023.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is committed to employment equity and diversity in the workplace and welcomes applications from women, visible minorities, Aboriginal peoples, persons with disabilities, and LGBTQ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant's accessibility needs. Teaching Fellows at Queen's University are governed by the <u>Collective Agreement</u> for <u>Teaching Assistants and Teaching Fellows between PSAC Local 901 and Queen's University</u>. The academic staff at Queen's University are governed by the <u>Collective Agreement between the Queen's University Faculty Association (QUFA) and the University</u>. Remuneration will be in accordance with the Collective Agreement, and appointments are subject to funding or enrolment criteria.

To comply with Federal laws, the University is obliged to gather statistical information about how many applicants for each job vacancy are Canadian citizens / permanent residents of Canada. Applications should include ten (10) jpeg images of recent studio practice artwork, a letter of interest, letters of reference from two (2) referees or contact information for two (2) referees, a complete and current curriculum vitae, 10-15 student work samples in the related media and any other relevant materials the candidate wishes to submit for consideration such as a letter of intent, teaching dossier and teaching philosophy. **Please arrange to have applications sent directly to:**

## ARTF 125/3.0 Units Introduction to Studio Art in Printmaking

Designed to appeal to studio novice and seasoned artist alike, this course seeks to foster a broad understanding of historical and contemporary printmaking processes, through hands on studio assisted projects. These will cover lithography, etching relief, book binding, hand transfer and photo-digital etching. Overall emphasis is on experimentation and exploration of imagery. Not available for credit towards a B.F.A. program.
