

**TEACHING FELLOW POSITION and/or TERM ADJUNCT POSITION AVAILABLE****ARTF 337 – Advanced Programs I (Sculpture/New Media)  
Fine Art (Visual Art) Program**

The Fine Art (Visual Art) Program at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching an undergraduate course of ***Advanced Programs I / Sculpture/New Media (ARTF 337, 9 units)***. This is a 12-week on-campus studio course with an expected enrolment of 16 students. Teaching Fellow applicants should be enrolled as a Ph.D. student in a program at Queen's University. Teaching Fellow and Term Adjunct applicants should have an M.F.A. in Visual Art; candidates with teaching experience at the university level in Sculpture are preferred. In addition to the above requirements, candidates should be practicing artists with an active exhibition record. This appointment is for the Fall 2023 term, September 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023, with classes in session from September 5, 2023 to December 8, 2023.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is committed to employment equity and diversity in the workplace and welcomes applications from women, visible minorities, Aboriginal peoples, persons with disabilities, and LGBTQ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.

Remuneration will be in accordance with the Collective Agreement, and appointments are subject to funding or enrolment criteria.
