GLOBAL PERSPECTIVE & EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

Global mindedness is key to Castle Summer+. During the six-week program, you will apply your classroom learning through virtual experiential learning opportunities. For example, in the past, online students have discovered how to work with primary sources – medieval manuscripts- using 21st century digitalisation and transcription software. Students have also been able to experience traditional art museums under a different light, through virtual gallery tours with their professors.

NDEPENDENT STUDY

The 594 Independent Study course is designed to immerse you in a unique, graduate-style experience and enhance your global intelligence. You will build your understanding of cross-cultural similarities and differences while working with an expert in the field, and develop your research through presentation and discussion (594 research projects must be approved by the relevant department in advance). Previous students have taken on research topics like British fashion and youth culture expressed in British cinema of the 60s and 70s for Film and Media Studies, Europe's 'Migrant Crisis' in 2016, pre- and post-Brexit for Global Development, and accuracy in eyewitness accounts for Psychology.

Fees will be charged in accordance with the Faculty of Arts and Science tuition rates.

- Minimum 1.6 GPA
- Level 2 standing (by the start of the program)
