

# MOUSEION REPORT FOR CAC COUNCIL AND AGM

May 4 & 7, 2026



1. RECENT AND UP-COMING ISSUES.
  - 21.1. Special issue (Comics and Classics). The files for this issue were sent to the press in May, 2025, but the issue did not appear online until December 2025 and has still not appeared in print.
  - 21.2 Regular archaeology issue. The files are at the press. Four articles and three reviews. The editors have seen the proofs. Online publication expected on May 8<sup>th</sup>.
  - 21.3 Regular issue. Five articles and three reviews. The files are at the press and being copyedited.
  - 22.1 Special issue on Roman Republican military history (guest editor Pierre-Luc Brisson). Five articles and three reviews. Files sent to press on May 1<sup>st</sup>.
  - 22.2 Regular archaeological issue.
  - 22.3 Special issue on Dress and Adornment (guest editors Melissa Funke and Katelin McCullough). Five articles.
2. PUBLICATION SCHEDULE

The publication schedule continues to be behind, mainly because of the slowness of the press. They have had the files for 21.2 and 21.3 for several months, but we have only recently seen the editors' proofs for 21.2. The press indicates that 21.2 will be available online as of May 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Several special issues are in various stages of preparation, and these, along with regular submissions, should allow us to "catch up".
3. SUBMISSIONS

Since the AGM last year, we have received 32 submissions, including the Actio from the last CAC. 18 of the submissions are part of special issues. 21 came into our [mouseion@mun.ca](mailto:mouseion@mun.ca) email address and nine through the ScholarOne portal.

Most of the submissions have come from Canada and the United States, but there have also been a number from Spain and Israel.
4. *MOUSEION* SUPPORT FOR A MINI-CONFERENCE (12-14 JUNE 2025)

The mini-conference, "Domesticated? Female Animals and Animalized Women in the Greek and Roman worlds or, La Belle et la Bête? Female Beasts and Bestial Women," at Memorial University, June 12-14, 2025 was a

great success. Several presenters have submitted their papers to *Mouseion*, and work on the special issue for these papers has begun.

5. Changes at the Journal

Dr. Carolyn Willekes, Mount Royal University, has replaced Dr. Kevin Solez as the journal's secretary-treasurer. The editors are very happy to have Dr. Willekes on board and thank Dr. Solez for his work.

6. Finances

As can be seen by the financial report prepared by Carolyn Willekes and Kevin Solez, *Mouseion's* financial situation is quite healthy. The combined royalties from Project Muse and EBSCO currently cover our costs. We can anticipate that, if we publish more issues in 2026-2027, our costs will increase, but so will the royalties, and we have savings that will cover any one-time losses.
