The fellowship will be awarded to a graduate student, or an upper year undergraduate student, on the basis of demonstrated financial need, academic achievement, and a written proposal, who is intending (These alternatives are listed in order of priority.):

- 1) to pursue original work (a thesis or other project) in Greece on a subject related to Greece of any historical period, in philology, archaeology, history, or philosophy; **or**
- 2) to participate in a summer session or excavation in Greece sponsored by the Canadian Archaeological Institute in Athens, The American School of Classical Studies at Athens, or other approved institutions; **or**
- 3) to attend a program at The American School of Classical Studies at Athens, The College Year in Athens, or other approved institution.
