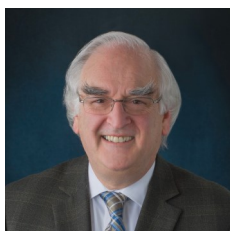


#### **Adrienne Davidson**

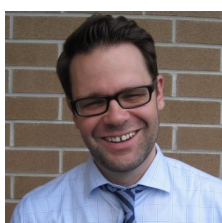


#### **Kim Richard Nossal**
