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THE ASSOCIATE VICE-PROVOST (TEACHING AND LEARNING)

2015-2016 has been a banner year for the Centre for Teaching and Learning. With a long history of The Evolution of Educational Development@Queen's, we worked hard and long to re-define ourselves to build on existing supports and programs. We re-examined all the work we do and re-organized ourselves accordingly. We reflected on the work we have been doing and forged new directions and initiatives.

Of course, there were several important activities already in place that continue to work well. Many of the events run in the past (Showcase, TD Day, Course Design institute, SGS 901) are consistently praised and valued by participants. These well-established events focus on bringing educators together to share their own innovations and scholarly educational initiatives.

We decided to evolve some of our existing programs. Specifically, we have re-vamped graduate student educational programming, incorporating a TA Advisory Committee and a department-based peer mentoring initiative. We are in the process of re-configuring our graduate course, SGS 901 – Teaching and Learning in Higher Education, into a blended format, based on a successful Ontario Online Institute grant. And we refreshed the granting programs, tripling the amount of funding available for course enhancements.

Of note, new this year were the Principal's Teaching and Learning Awards, a multi-department collaboration to recognize educational leadership across campus. Along similar lines, we collaborated with the Principal's office to develop the Principal's Dream Courses initiative. We developed the Educational research grants and increased our educational granting programs by 400%. We instituted new programs and invited exciting guest speakers to Queen's to engage with our campus community. We moved offices to a more accessible (and brighter) space in Mac-Corry.

Recognizing that the tools and contexts for teaching and learning can have a great impact on both students and educators alike, we also helped to advocate for and directly resource enhanced educational support for onQ and classroom renovation investments.

To meet our new vision, we focused internally on solidifying and re-organizing how the work of our unit operates. We have articulated 4 areas of focus for our 4 educational developers and worked to further develop resources, services and initiatives – curriculum development, onQ and classroom, graduate student development and educational and undergraduate research. To complement the existing CTL staff who work with educators across campus, we welcomed Cory Laverty, Librarian and Selina Idlas, onQ Educational Support to the CTL team.

We are working on still more projects that will emerge in the coming months, including the Educational Leadership Initiative, the Creative Expressions of Teaching and Learning art show and educational resources for classrooms and onQ use. These are just an indication of the bright future of educational development at Queen's.

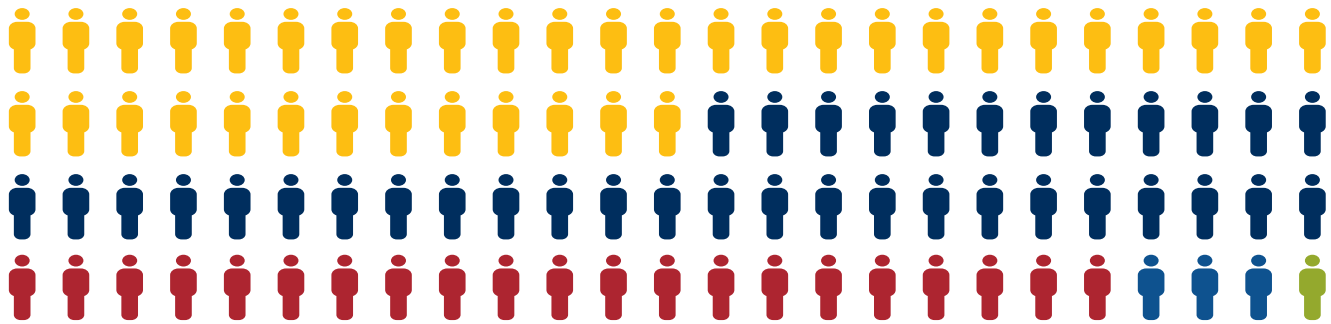
