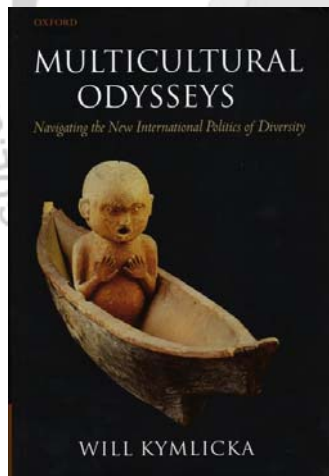


Conference dinner with Keynote Speaker Will Kymlicka: Multicultural Odysseys: Dilemmas in the Global Diffusion of Multiculturalism



Drawing on some of his own experiences in the field, Will Kymlicka discusses the potential and pitfalls accompanying the process of globalizing multiculturalism. Kymlicka explains why multicultural success stories in Canada and elsewhere are difficult to replicate or diffuse, making the task of formulating international standards of minority rights very difficult. This requires us to rethink how Canada can best contribute to international debates on issues of diversity.

Will Kymlicka is the Canada Research Chair in Political Philosophy at Queen's University, and a visiting professor in the Nationalism Studies program at the Central European University in Budapest. A member of the Royal Society of Canada, he received the 2004 Killam Prize and in 2005 was named a Trudeau Foundation Fellow.



Translated into 30 languages, Kymlicka's edited volumes and books focus on issues of citizenship in multi-ethnic democratic societies and with the challenges of nationalism and multiculturalism. He is the author of six books published by Oxford University Press (OUP) including: *Multicultural Citizenship* (1995), which was awarded the Macpherson Prize by the Canadian Political Science Association, and the Bunche Award by the American Political Science Association; and *Multicultural Odysseys: Navigating the New International Politics of Diversity* (2007). Most recently, Kymlicka co-edited with William M. Sullivan *The Globalization of Ethics: Religious and Secular Perspectives* (Cambridge UP, 2007).

Ethnic diversity and self-government: How to defend pluralism without statism and culturalism

Rainer Bauböck, European University Institute, holds the chair in social and political theory at the Department of Political and Social Sciences of the European University Institute.

He is on leave from the Austrian Academy of Sciences, Institute for European Integration Research where he is also vice-chair of the Academy's Commission for Migration and Integration Research.

Rainer Bauböck is the author of *Transnational Citizenship, Membership and Rights in International Migration* (1994) and editor of a series of books on migration, citizenship and diversity.

Most recently, he coordinated two comparative research projects on citizenship laws and policies in the European Union. Results have been published in three volumes with Amsterdam University press: *The Acquisition and Loss of Nationality, Policies and Trends in 15 European states* (vol.1: comparative analyses, vol.2 country analyses), and: *Citizenship Policies in the New Europe*, April 2007.
