Reflecting her interdisciplinary graduate work, Professor Slinn's research is interdisciplinary and uses empirical methods of analysis.

Sara Slinn is also an arbitrator and mediator, has been named by the Ontario Minister of Labour, Immigration, Skills and Development to the list of approved grievance arbitrators and is a member of the Grievance Settlement Board. She has also practiced labour and employment law with both the British Columbia Labour and a private law firm in Vancouver.
