

**\*UPDATED\* ENSC Graduate Supervisory Committee Composition**

**ALL Research-based** (MES-R and PhD) graduate student Supervisory Committees **MUST** consist of at least **ONE (1) CORE or CROSS-APPOINTED ENSC Faculty** member, and **MUST** include a **MINIMUM of three (3) members** comprised of:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Member(s): Supervisor(s)
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Member: Queen's faculty member
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Member: Another faculty\* OR a community member\*\*

*\* If the 3<sup>rd</sup> member is faculty they can be from ENSC, or another unit at Queen's, or from another academic institution.*

*\*\* If the 3<sup>rd</sup> member is a community member this could include (but is not limited to): government workers, non-government organization personnel, farmers, city planners and/or engineers, local experts, etc.*

**Course-based Master's (MES-C) students** are NOT expected to have a Supervisory Committee in place but still require a program Supervisor who is either an **ENSC CORE or CROSS-APPOINTED Faculty member**. If the Supervisor is an Adjunct, then an ENSC Core or Cross-Appointed Faculty member **MUST** be included as a co-supervisor.

Supervisory Committees should be in place before the end of the **Second Term or early in the Third Term BY THE LATEST**. All graduate students should hold their very first Supervisory Committee meeting early in the third term and will schedule future committee meetings **at least once per year** for the duration of their program.
