The School of Environmental Studies at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching the course [Wildlife Issues in a Changing World \(ENSC 320/3.0\)](#). This course will be offered on-campus with an expected enrolment of 100 students. This is a Fall-term appointment for the period September 1, 2026, to December 31, 2026, with classes in session from September 8, 2026, to December 8, 2026.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority. Please indicate in your application if you have a valid legal work status in Canada. Applications from all qualified candidates will be considered in the applicant pool. In order to support your employment at Queen's, we require you to indicate whether or not you will need a work permit.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant's accessibility needs. Graduate Teaching Assistant and Teaching Fellows at Queen's University are governed by the [Collective Agreement for Teaching Assistants and Teaching Fellows between PSAC Local 901 and Queen's University](#).

The stipend for this position will be between \$9,924 and \$11,165 plus salary in lieu of benefits and vacation pay in accordance with Schedule A of the *Collective Agreement*.

Applicants must be an enrolled PhD student at Queen's University. Applications should include a statement of relevant qualifications in relation to environmental studies, wildlife issues, biodiversity conservation, ecosystem management or a closely related discipline, a curriculum vitae, the statement on valid legal work status as noted above, and a short note or email from at least one referee, normally their supervisor, to be sent directly to Dr. Ryan Danby as well as any other relevant materials that the candidate wishes to submit for consideration such as a teaching dossier, etc. Teaching Fellows will be provided mentoring and assistance throughout their appointment by the Director of the School and/or the Centre for Teaching and Learning.
