The School of Environmental Studies at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching [Waste Flows: Environmental Studies of Waste](#) (ENSC 445/845). This is an in-person teaching, fourth-year seminar course with an expected enrolment of ~20 students. Candidates should have a MA, MSc, or PhD, and teaching experience at the university level in Canadian and Global Waste Issues, Waste Governance and Management, or a closely related discipline. This is a fall term appointment for the period September 1, 2026, to December 31, 2026, with classes in session from September 8, 2026, to December 8, 2026.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority. Please indicate in your application if you have a valid legal work status in Canada. Applications from all qualified candidates will be considered in the applicant pool. In order to support your employment at Queen's, we require you to indicate whether or not you will need a work permit.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant's accessibility needs. The stipend for this position will be between \$9,500 and \$13,500. Actual salary will be commensurate with years of teaching experience and course weight, as per the Queen's-QUFA Collective Agreement.

Applications should include a cover letter (which includes a statement on valid legal work status in Canada as described above) a complete and current curriculum vitae, letters of reference from two (2) referees, and any other relevant materials the candidate wishes to submit for consideration such as a teaching dossier, etc. Applicants are encouraged to send all documents in their application packages electronically as PDFs to **Dr. Ryan Danby, Director, School of Environmental Studies**, at [envst@queensu.ca](mailto:envst@queensu.ca).

Applications will be received until June 15, 2026. Review of applications will commence shortly thereafter. Applications will be considered after this date if the position remains unfilled.
