



**Pediatric Hematologist/Oncologist
Queen's University, Department of Pediatrics**

The Department of Pediatrics in the Faculty of Health Sciences at Queen's University invites applications for a full-time pediatric hematologist/oncologist. Preference will be given to applicants who are Royal College or American Board certified in pediatric hematology/oncology, however, applicants with equivalent training may be considered. Eligibility for licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario is required.

The successful applicant will join an established Pediatric Hematologist/Oncologist to form a Division within the Department of Pediatrics. Kingston Health Sciences Centre is home to a Children's Oncology Group member clinical program and works closely with the Pediatric Oncology Group of Ontario as one of five specialized pediatric oncology centres. The Division will collaborate closely with the adult Division of Hematology and Department of Oncology.

Nestled on the shores of Lake Ontario, Kingston is a beautiful historic city offering a wealth of recreational activities. Queen's University is one of Canada's premier universities and medical schools. The successful candidate will enjoy exceptional academic, professional, and lifestyle opportunities.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity, and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous/Aboriginal people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.

To comply with Federal laws, the University is obliged to gather statistical information about how many applicants for each job vacancy are Canadian citizens/permanent residents of Canada. Applicants need not identify their country of origin; however, all applications must include one of the following statements: "I am a Canadian citizen/permanent resident of Canada"; OR, "I am not a Canadian citizen/permanent resident of Canada". Applications that do not include this information will be deemed incomplete.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant's accessibility needs. Review of applications will commence immediately and continue until the position is filled.
