ENVIRONMENTAL DNA WORKSHOP

The Queen's University Biological Station (QUBS) is offering a four-day Environmental DNA Workshop this summer from **July 25 - 29** that will benefit those interested in eDNA research, evaluating research proposals and natural resource management.
