

This recognition means the world to me."

As a member of the College of New Scholars, Artists and Scientists, Dr. Christensen now holds a select seat reserved for Canada's leading intellectuals, researchers, and artists. However, she recognizes that her professional success is rooted in the contributions of others. "The work I have done thus far in my career has been made possible by northern, Indigenous communities and individuals who have trusted me with their stories, by incredible colleagues and collaborators, by the most wonderful students, by my family, my friends, by the traditional homelands of Indigenous people upon which I have grown, learned and pursued this path. While I am grateful for this recognition of my scholarship," says Julia, "my scholarship has not occurred within me as an individual person, but as someone who has been held up and supported by people, places and land."
