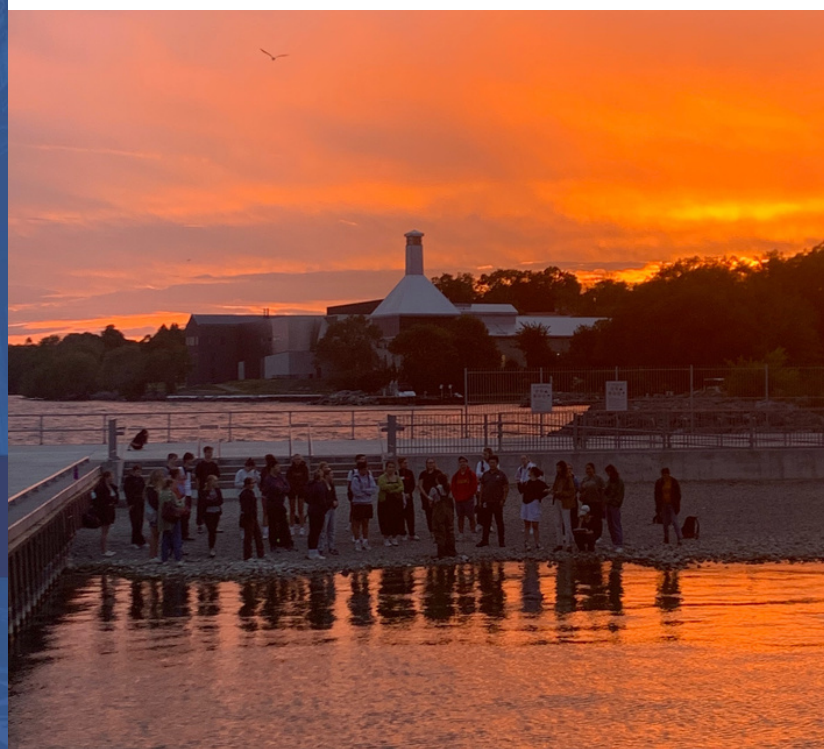

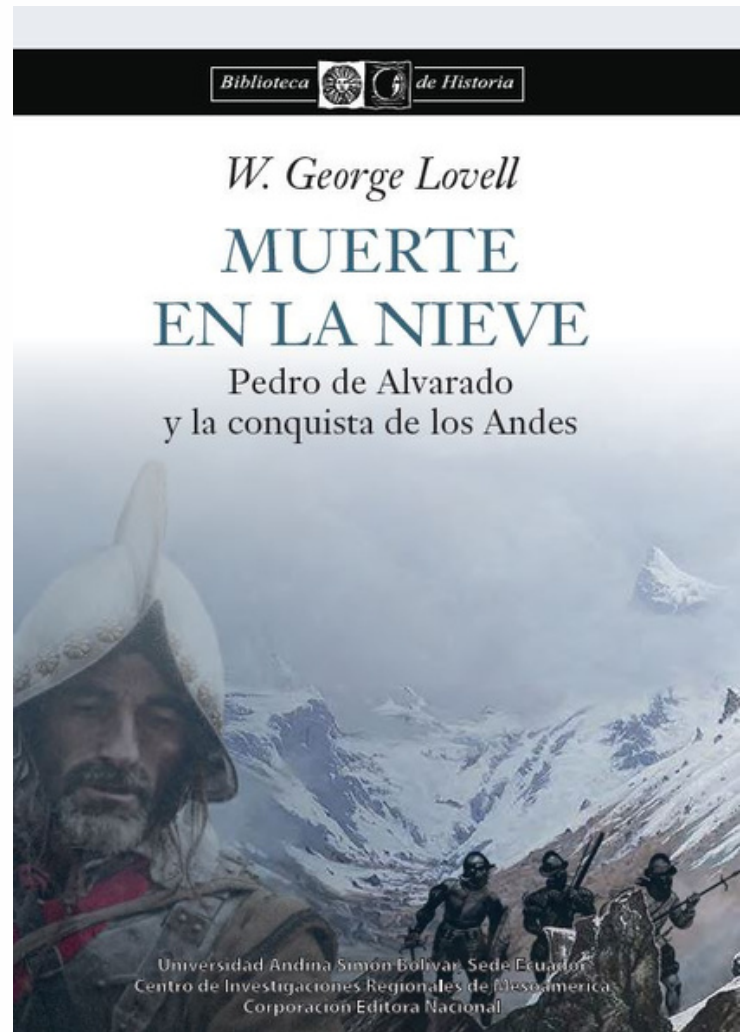

# Dr. George Lovell en Ecuador

George Lovell is in Ecuador this week, to present a paper at the **Congreso Ecuatoriano de Historia** in Quito, at which his latest book, *Muerte en la Nieve: Pedro de Alvarado y la Conquista de los Andes*, will be launched.

*Muerte en la Nieve* is a Spanish translation of *Death in the Snow: Pedro de Alvarado and the Illusive Conquest of Peru*, published late last year by **McGill-Queen's University Press**. The book's Agatha Christie-like title has sparked a welcome interest, as George claims it's crime writing of sorts, dealing with a little known episode of the Spanish conquest of South America.

A launch for the English-language original, to which members of the Department will receive an invitation, is to be hosted here in Kingston at Novel Idea (156 Princess Street) on November 15.
