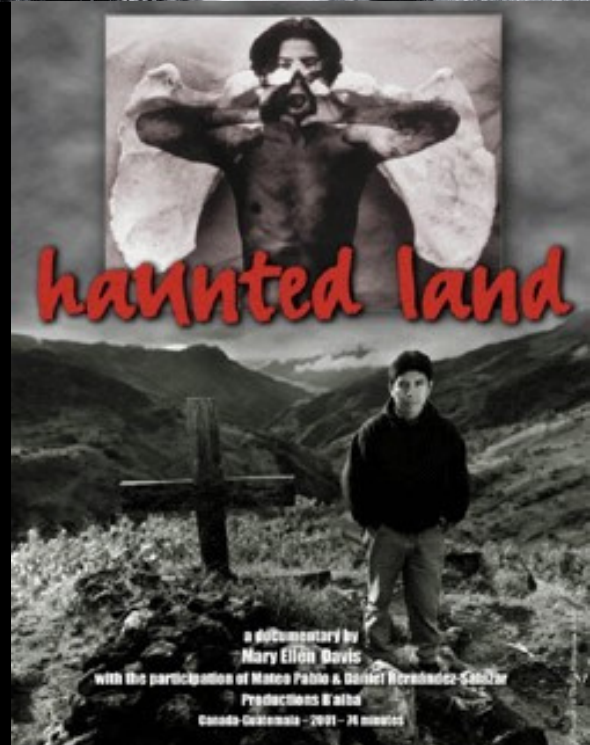


AWARD-WINNING DOCUMENTARY FILM SCREENING

Dr. Jean-Michel Lemieux is a Full professor in the Department of Geology and Geological Engineering at Laval University and a member of the Center for Northern Studies. His research focuses on the observation and numerical modeling of past, present, and future hydrogeological processes. His ongoing research projects involve quantitative management of groundwater resources in the Magdalen Islands (Gulf of St. Lawrence), the study of groundwater flow dynamics in clay slopes in relation to landslides, as well as cold regions hydrogeology. He also serves as Editor of the Hydrogeology Journal, published by the International Association of Hydrogeologists.
