This award entails attending the organization's annual conference being held in Toronto in 2019 to receive the award and to say a few words. In part, Laura's award letter read: *The IFPE board has identified your scholarship to be of great value and interest to the field. We therefore nominated you for our Distinguished Educator Award in 2019. We consider your book, Freud in Cambridge, written with the late John Forrester, to be important psychoanalytic work deserving of recognition in addressing questions of history and historicity of psychoanalysis and its impact on education. In particular, the book opened up a psychoanalytic approach to understanding the disappearance of psychoanalysis from the university and the move towards science.*
