The Department of History at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching a course in Issues in History (HIST 402 3.0 units). This is an in-person teaching seminar course offered to 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> year students enrolled in a History Major or Specialization, with an expected enrolment of 25 students. Candidates should propose a suitable subtitle for the course and detailed course description that focuses on some aspect of Jewish history in North America, broadly defined. Course title and description will be finalized in consultation with the Department Chair. Candidates should have a Ph.D, and teaching experience at the university level. This is a fall term appointment for the period September 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025, with classes in session from September 2, 2025 to December 2, 2025.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority. Please indicate in your application if you have a valid legal work status in Canada. Applications from all qualified candidates will be considered in the applicant pool. In order to support your employment at Queen's, we require you to indicate whether or not you will need a work permit.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant's accessibility needs.
