

TEACHING POSITION AVAILABLE – 2025/2026 HIST 404 – Themes in Diaspora History Department of History Queen's University, Kingston, ON CAN K7L 3N6

The Department of History at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching a course in Themes in Diaspora History (HIST 404 3.0 units). This is an in-person teaching seminar course offered to 3rd & 4th year students enrolled in a History Major or Specialization, with an expected enrolment of 25 students. Candidates should have a Ph.D, and teaching experience at the university level. This is a winter term appointment for the period January 1, 2026 to April 30, 2026, with classes in session from January 5, 2026 to April 6, 2026.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority. Please indicate in your application if you have a valid legal work status in Canada. Applications from all qualified candidates will be considered in the applicant pool. In order to support your employment at Queen's, we require you to indicate whether or not you will need a work permit.

Course Description:

HIST 404: Themes in Diaspora History

Theoretical and methodological approaches to the study of diaspora, and the social and cultural history of diasporic communities in the early modern and modern world. Labour, trade and migration; race, religion and identity; tensions between national, imperial and diasporic formations are explored with a focus on a specific historical example.
