UNDERGRADUATE BULLETIN: UPPER-YEAR REGISTRATION



Dear upper-year History Students,

In the fall of 2022, the Department of History will begin transitioning to a revised degree plan for all students who declared a History degree in the spring of 2021 and for all future Majors and Medials. This new degree plan requires 3.0-unit seminars instead of the 4.5-unit seminars of the previous plan. To meet the needs of both third and fourth year students during the 2022-2023 academic year, some seminars will be weighted at 3.0-units and others will be weighted at 4.5-units.

The department is dedicated to making sure this is a smooth transition for all students, so we have created this bulletin to help you learn more about your degree plan and determine which courses to take during the 2022-2023 year.

Which plan should I follow?

Pre-2021 Degree Plan

Students who enrolled in a History Major or Medial **prior to Spring 2021** will remain in their **original degree plan**, continuing with 4.5-unit upper-year seminars until graduation. Most students in the Pre-2021 degree plan will be entering their fourth-year of study in the fall of 2022. Students in this History Major plan require 6 upper-year seminar courses to graduate and a total of 60 units of History courses, while students in this History Medial plan require 4 upper-year seminar courses and a total of 42 units of History courses.

If you...

- Declared a Major/Medial in 2020 or earlier
- Have already completed one or more upper-year seminars weighted at 4.5units (HIST 333-499)
- Are going to be in fourthyear in Fall 2022

2021 ("New") Degree Plan

Students who enrolled in a History Major or Medial in the **spring of 2021 or later** are in the **new degree plan**, and will take 3.0-unit upper-year seminars to complete their History degree. Most students in the 2021 degree plan will be entering their third-year of study in the fall of 2022. Students in this History Major plan require 6 upper-year seminar courses to graduate and a total of 60 units of History courses, while students in this History Medial plan require 4 upper-year seminar courses and a total of 42 units of History courses.

Advanced Course Selection

July 4th - July 8th

All third and fourth-year History Major and Medial students are invited to participate in History's Advanced Course Selection period which runs from July 4 - July 8, 2022.

During Advanced Course Selection, upper-year History students are guaranteed early enrolment in two upper-year seminars for the 2022-2023 academic year. You will enroll yourself in the rest of your Fall and Winter courses during the regular enrollment period in July. We will provide you with an Advanced Course Selection form where you will indicate your top four choices for your upper-year seminars in Fall 2022 and Winter 2023. You will only be enrolled in two of the four seminars that you request, and we will do our best to accommodate your top choices.
