Attention first-year History students:

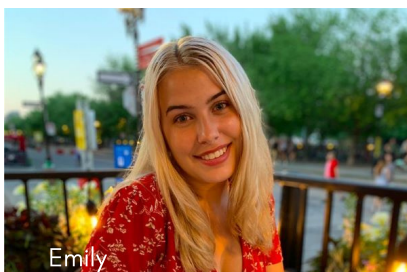
