Final Grade Options

After the end of the term, students who receive a passing grade in a History course will have the option of changing their final grade for Winter 2020 from the traditional letter grade to a Pass (P) grade. Students will have the option to change their final grade between May 11th and May 20th, 2020.

Students who fail an Arts and Science course can drop the course on SOLUS without academic penalty and can do so now until May 20th. The History Department recommends that, as always, you complete your courses to the best of your abilities and then consider whether you would benefit from a Pass grade or a late drop on May 11th.

There are several situations where selecting a Pass grade may not be in your best interest:

• **Ist Year Students**: If you are a 1st year student, the requirement for **automatic acceptance** to a History degree plan is a **C** in **a 100 level History course**. If you select a Pass grade for HIST 121, 122 or 124, you will be placed on the pending list and may or may not be accepted into the History degree plan. If you have earned a C or higher in your first-year course, we encourage you to keep that grade on your transcript, so you are eligible for automatic acceptance.

 Dean's Honour List: To be eligible for the Dean's Honour List you must have completed 18.0 units excluding nonevaluative grades. Pass grades will not count towards the requirements for Dean's Honour List. See Academic Regulation
Item 12.

The Faculty of Arts and Science recommends that students familiarize themselves with any applicable Academic Regulation and related grade policies prior to requesting a (P) pass grade.
