Credit system	UC Credit System One credit: one hour of work per week. This includes both contact hours and individual work, during 18 weeks (one semester). A full time student is expected to accumulate 50 credits per semester, usually 5 courses of 10 credits each (4 contact hours a week * + 6 hours of individual work per week). The total is 900 hours per semester. UC does not restrict the number of credits international students may take, though we do advise not to take more than 30-40 UC credits per semester, depending on their Spanish language proficiency. *3 sessions of 80 minutes each. - <i>Minimum academic load full-time UC students = 30 UC credits per semester.</i>

Programs/courses open to exchange students	<p>All, except Medicine and Music. In addition, there are restrictions on the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Music: Only theory courses. 2) Medicine: Only certain theoretical courses in public health and clinical rotations. Odontology, Nutrition and Dietetics and Kinesiology are not available to apply. 3) Economics and Administrative Sciences: Courses restricted to applicants who fulfill the requirements of each course. 4) Psychology Courses: Students in their second to fourth year in the major may apply. 5) Biological Sciences: Marine Biology courses are not available. 6) Art Courses: Art courses are available only to Art major applicants. 7) Achitecture: provide a 2 pages PDF portfolio (letter size). Students can apply only to: Taller de proyectos (Formación 1st-3rd year / Ejercitación 4th y 5th year) Core courses (no restriction) and elective courses (2 as maximum). Student cannot apply to: Aulas de Título (career final project), Taller de Investigación(reasearch workshop), Práctica de Obras y Práctica Profesional (professional practice). There are few spots at Architecture and acceptance cannot be guaranteed. 8) Sports Courses: Students must bring their personal equipment to class, according to their sport of interest. 9) Performing Arts: students who are interested in registering for practical courses at the school of Performing Arts must attach a personal video showing a scene and a monologue in Spanish.

Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile has complete student health services, including all medical specialties, dental attention, psychological attention and counseling, for the exclusive use of its students (Students must have their own Health Insurance and pay for the cost of all health services). Students must ask for refunding of any medical expense made in Chile to his own Health Insurance company.
