What is the minimum/maximum number of courses a student may register in? <i>The regular full-time course load per semester is 30 ECTS. Most courses are 10 ECTS each so most students take three 10 credit courses</i></p>

Does it cover the student if they travel to other countries outside of the country of the host institution?	No. Students must bring travel insurance or other adequate insurance from home if planning to go abroad while studying in Norway.
For what period(s) of time does it cover the student?	For as long as they are registered as living in Norway.
Does it cover the student traveling to your country?	No. Students must have coverage from home for the travel to Norway and for the first time in Norway, until they are registered as residents in Norway and as students here.
If the student provides evidence of sufficient health care coverage from home, could they be exempted from purchasing Health insurance?	Yes.
