Please submit a brief (under one page) letter of interest to mathcamps@queensu.ca. In your letter, please indicate:

- your availability during summer 2026
- whether you are interested in RabbitMath, Math Quest, or both camps
- if you are interested in leading one or more (~1.5-hour) sessions
- any previous experience working with youth, teaching, tutoring, mentoring, or leading activities

Hourly Rate: \$27.50 per hour plus 4% vacation pay

Hours per Week: Hours will vary depending on camp schedules, training sessions, and program responsibilities. Most camp work will take place during the week of August 10-14, 2026, between 9:00am and 4:00pm. Instructors leading mathematics sessions will be compensated for prep time. There are no evening or overnight responsibilities associated with this role. Preference will be given to applicants who are available to commit to one or more full camp days.

Job Summary:

The Department of Mathematics and Statistics is seeking enthusiastic and responsible individuals to support the delivery of its summer outreach programs, including RabbitMath and Math Quest. These camps provide engaging mathematical experiences for high school students through hands-on activities, collaborative problem solving, and community-building experiences.

Math Camp Tutors will assist with planning and leading camp sessions, mentoring students, facilitating activities, and supporting the overall camp environment. Successful candidates may contribute to curriculum development, design and lead mathematical enrichment activities, and support collaborative learning experiences. Tutors who lead sessions will receive additional compensated time for reasonable preparation and planning associated with those activities.

This is an excellent opportunity for graduate students, undergraduate students, educators, and

others with strong mathematical backgrounds who are interested in outreach, teaching, mentorship, and youth engagement.

Key Responsibilities:

- Assist with the planning and delivery of inclusive mathematical enrichment activities and camp sessions
- Lead or co-lead workshops, games, and collaborative learning activities
- Support campers during academic and recreational activities
- Help create a positive, inclusive, safe, and supportive camp environment
- Participate in staff training, orientation, and planning meetings
- Communicate professionally with campers, families, and fellow staff members
- Submit a final report summarizing your activities at the camp's conclusion.

Required Qualifications:

- Strong interest in mathematics, statistics, science, education, or related fields
- Experience working with youth in educational, recreational, mentoring, or leadership settings is an asset
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- Ability to work collaboratively as part of a team
- Strong organizational and problem-solving skills
- Ability to demonstrate professionalism, responsibility, and good judgment
- Current undergraduate or graduate student status is considered an asset
- Standard First Aid/CPR certification is considered an asset
- Available for many or all of the camp dates, August 10-14, 2026
