Preference will be given to qualified graduate students in the Department of Mathematics and Statistics who meet the following conditions:

- currently enrolled in a Doctoral program.
- have passed the applicable thesis prospectus exam or the comprehensive exam for their program.
- have completed the Teaching Apprenticeship program with 15 hours of classroom instructional training or have equivalent post-secondary teaching training.

A complete application will consist of all transcripts, a curriculum vitae as well as any other relevant materials the candidate wishes to submit for consideration such as a teaching dossier or student evaluations. **The deadline for applying is Tuesday, June 30, 2026.** Review of completed applications will begin after this date and continue until all positions are filled. The final appointments are subject to budgetary approval and regular staffing.
