It's Just a Joke:
Thinking Online Politics with Jorge Portilla

In this talk, I argue that the philosophy of Jorge Portilla can help us understand the current social and political conditions of the United States. In particular, I draw from Portilla's account of relajo and his writing on community as horizon. I argue that Portilla's account of the person who engages in relajo accurately describes the character of individuals posting on various online spaces, particularly 4chan. Integral to Portilla's analysis of relajo is a disavowal of agency and a recognition of the affective forces that lead individuals to participate in these spaces: the disavowal of one's agency does not mean that one stops having desires and resentments. A continuous disavowal of one's agency and one's responsibility to account for these affects places one in a position where one's agency can be hijacked and reoriented towards other goals. Hence, Portilla provides us with an analytic framework for understanding how a website that encourages nihilistic humor can be commandeered toward extremist politics.
