

Information for Selecting TAships

- Please select that you are applying for positions in both Fall term and Winter term to allow you to submit your preferences for both terms. As much as possible we try to make all TA assignments for both terms at the beginning of the school year.
- Please be aware of the notes about some of the courses listed here. These are intended to help you make decisions about which courses you might be comfortable TAing for.
- Wherever possible, please try to ensure that you will be able to attend at least one class a week for the courses you wish to TA for. Many instructors would prefer that you attend as many classes as possible for your TA course. We understand that attending your own classes means it is not always possible to attend every class for your TA course, but you will need to ensure that you can attend some class sessions each week.
- The TA Application form will ask you to list your 5 top preferences for TAship. We cannot guarantee any specific course, but will do our best to accommodate your interests.
- The TA Application form will ask you which “Group” you fall under as defined by PSAC, the Graduate Student & TA Union. As a 1st year student in your program, applying for a TAship in your home department of Philosophy, you would fall under Group A.
