**Peacock Post-Doctoral Fellowship
Queen's University
Department of Political Studies**

The Department of Political Studies at Queen's University invites applications for the Peacock Post-Doctoral Fellowship in the area of International Relations.

This fellowship provides an opportunity to spend time in an intellectually stimulating environment conducting research, writing, and teaching. Total salary: \$36,000 (unlike some post-doctoral fellowships, this PDF is taxable because it carries full Queen's benefits). This sum does not include teaching two half-courses, the subject of which will be negotiated with the Head of Department. The fellowship is tenable for 24 months from 1 September 2022.

Eligibility: preference will be given to citizens and permanent residents of Canada who are not already in a tenure-stream position. Candidates must have been awarded a doctorate in political science from a recognized university no earlier than 1 January 2019; or have completed the doctorate no earlier than 1 January 2017 but have had their career interrupted or delayed for family reasons; or expect to have completed all degree requirements by 31 August 2022.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's University is committed to employment equity and diversity in the workplace and welcomes applications from women, visible minorities, aboriginal people, persons with disabilities, and persons of any sexual orientation or gender identity.

Postdoctoral fellows at Queen's University are governed by two collective agreements.
