The Department of Political Studies at Queen's University invites applications for a two-year term adjunct position teaching courses related to the New Global Order. We are seeking political science scholars in International Relations with an expertise in China, Russia or Latin America. We are particularly interested in offering courses in the politics of climate change.

This is a full-time position, and the successful candidate would be expected to teach four one-term courses at the undergraduate and graduate level. The incumbent would provide committee and other service to the Department as negotiated with the Department Head. Supervision of undergraduate thesis students and Master's level research projects would also be expected.

The annual salary is \$80,000 plus benefits. The deadline to apply is July 15th and candidates would start on December 1, 2022.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous/Aboriginal people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.

The academic staff at Queen's University are governed by the *Collective Agreement* between the Queen's University Faculty Association (QUFA) and the University, which is posted at [2019-2022 Queen's University-QUFA Collective Agreement](#).

To comply with Federal laws, the University is obliged to gather statistical information about how many applicants for each job vacancy are Canadian citizens / permanent residents of Canada. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or citizenship, however, all applications must include one of the following statements: "I am a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada"; OR, "I am not a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada". Applications that do not include this information will be deemed incomplete.

Applications must include a cover letter that includes their teaching interests, a current C.V. and a one (1) page, single spaced statement outlining their teaching philosophy. Applicants must provide the names and contact information of three referees who may be contacted later in the process.
