Keith Banting

Keith Banting is the Stauffer-Dunning Fellow in the School of Policy Studies and Professor Emeritus in the Department of Political Studies at Queen's University. He has a long-standing research interest in the politics of social policy and more recently, he has focused on the politics of multicultural policy. Professor Banting is a Member of the Order of Canada and a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada.

Patti Lenard

Patti Tamara Lenard is Associate Professor of Ethics in the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs, University of Ottawa. She is the author of *Trust, Democracy and Multicultural Challenges* (Penn State, 2012). Her current research focuses on the moral questions raised by migration across borders in an era of terrorism, as well as on multiculturalism, trust and social cohesion, and democratic theory more generally.
