Teaching Term Appointment

The Department of Psychology at Memorial University of Newfoundland invites applications for a three-year Teaching Term position in the Department of Psychology at the rank of Assistant Professor.

The successful candidate will (1) have a doctorate degree in psychology, and (2) be able to teach courses in our undergraduate program in areas where we need coverage in human psychology, particularly in clinical and social psychology. Previous teaching in a university setting would be an asset.

Applicants should submit (1) a cover letter summarizing their interest in the position; 2) a curriculum vitae; (3) a statement of their teaching philosophy and evidence of teaching effectiveness; and (4) names, email and mailing addresses of 3 referees to:
